We would like to remind our visitors of the following;:

- ❖ All people are encouraged to participate in the sacred services of our Church. We hope that you will be able to worship as well as have fellowship with us. Should you wish any information about the Orthodox Faith or this parish in particular, please see the rector or any member of the church. We are able to place you on our mailing list.
- ❖ Only Orthodox Christians may receive the Eucharist (Holy Communion) in the Orthodox Church. In like manner, Orthodox Christians may not receive the sacraments in a non-Orthodox Church. While we hope that one day all Christians will find unity and be able to approach the chalice of our Lord together, we observe the teachings of the Church that the Eucharist is a gift of unity and not a means of unity.

We remind our faithful and visitors of the following guidelines concerning the Holy Sacraments in the Orthodox Church.

- ❖ Orthodox Christians are urged to receive Holy Communion frequently.
- ❖ Communicants should be at peace with others before approaching the chalice (Mt 5:23-24)
- ❖ Realize the importance of making a thorough examination of sins and transgressions against God, ourselves and others and having prayed for forgiveness before coming to Holy Communion.
- ❖ Frequent communicants should come to Holy Confession at least four times a year (during the four fasting periods of the year) and additionally when an examination of conscience reveals the necessity to do so in order to heal any sinful behavior.
- ❖ Communicants should fast from all foods and liquids from the evening before receiving Holy Communion.
- ❖ Communicants should read prayers in preparation for receiving Holy Communion.
- ❖ All Orthodox Christians must receive the sacraments at least once a year.
- ❖ Those who are late for Divine Liturgy (after the reading of the Epistle and Gospel) should not approach the chalice.
- ❖ Those who are ill or who have special physical needs are exempt from the above guidelines.
- ❖ Infants and children (up to the age of seven) who are Orthodox Christians may receive Holy Communion and are exempt from the above guidelines.

Thank you for gathering to worship with us today. Together we have glorified the One God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. May we be brought closer to one another and closer to God by following the eternal teachings of our Lord.

Lesson from the Epistle of Saint Paul to the Hebrews

(c. 4, v. 14-16; c. 5, v. 1-6)

Brethren, we have a great High Priest, who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God. Therefore, let us cling to the religion we profess. For we have not a high priest, who is unable to sympathize with our sufferings, but one, who Has been through every trial like ourselves, yet without sinning. Therefore, let us approach his gracious throne fearlessly to receive mercy, grace, and support in the hour of need.

Every high priest is chosen among men and is appointed by men for divine worship to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He can deal gently with the ignorant and misguided, since he himself is subject to weakness. For this reason, he is obliged to offer sacrifices for sins, not only for the people, but for himself as well.

No one takes this office upon himself unless he is called by God, as Aaron was. Thus, Christ also did not invest himself with the glory of the high priest. On the contrary, he was invested by God, who said to him: "You are my Son. Today I have begotten you." He also said in another passage: "You are a priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek."

Він має бути покликаний Богом, як то було з Аароном.⁵ Так само й Христос не обрав Самого Себе, щоб одержати цю Славу стати первосвящеником, то Бог зробив це, сказавши Йому:

«Ти — Син Мій, сьогодні Я став Твоїм Отцем». Те ж говориться і в іншому місці Святого Писання :«Священик Ти навіки, як той Мелхіседек».

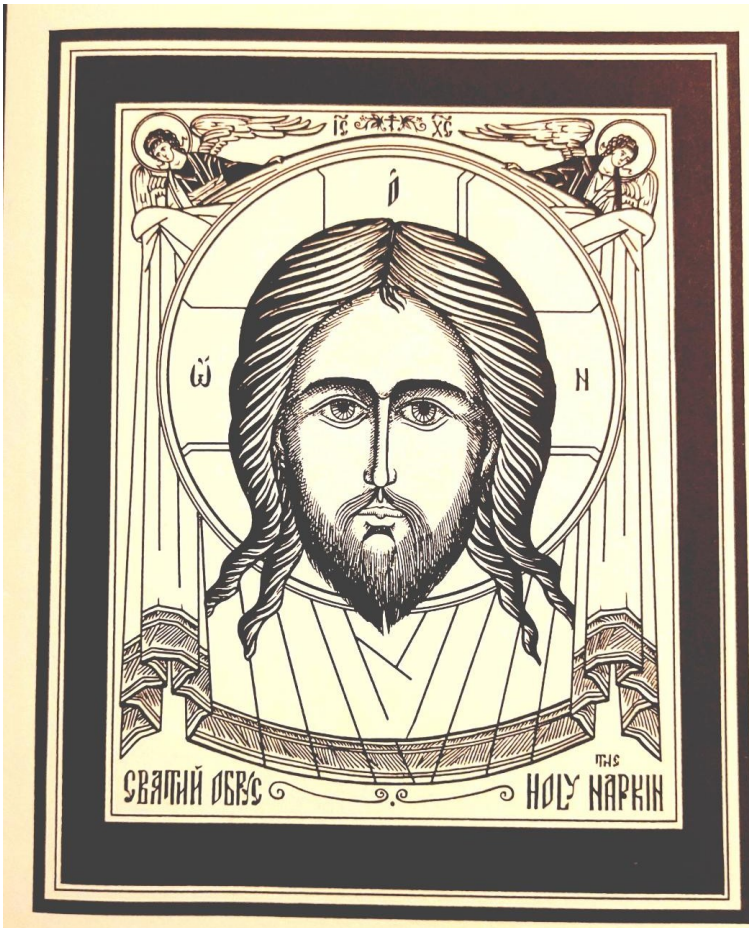

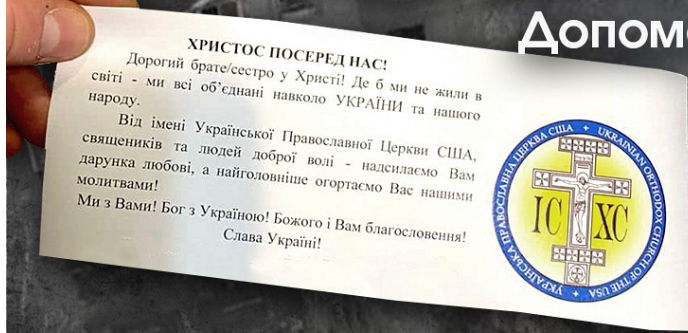

This performance will also be livestreamed on the Pittsburgh Symphony's digital platform, Front Row and broadcast live by WQED-FM (89.3). Though there is no charge to attend the concert, the Pittsburgh Symphony and Manfred Honeck are asking those who attend or stream the concert to make donations for humanitarian relief in Ukraine and has partnered with the United Way of Southwestern Pennsylvania for this effort. All of the artists are donating their services for this concert. UPMC Health Plan has generously provided major support for this concert.



UOC OF THE USA Delivers Humanitarian Aid to Ukraine

УПЦ США Розпочала Постачання Гуманітарної Допомоги в Україну



Three days after the Russian Federation crossed the sovereign borders of Ukraine, an independent nation recognized as such by all nations of the world, it became abundantly clear that much assistance would be needed from all freedom loving people around the world. After 30 years of independence – the only nation of the former Soviet Union to achieve such, originally, without the shedding of a drop of blood – many in Ukraine and beyond held on to the belief that the Vladimir Putin would not really risk the welfare of his own nation in an attempt to rebuild his beloved, but utterly failed soviet union. They were wrong. There is no one who can explain the irrational thoughts and actions of a self-isolated autocrat who seems to have severed himself from reality. A new invasion of Ukraine has begun with what can only be defined as another genocide against the population of Ukraine. It became clear instantly, that Ukraine would not surrender easily, and the defense of the nation has been something incredible to behold, but at an enormous cost in loss of life, injuries, millions of refugees fleeing to neighboring countries. This invasion should actually be considered as Phase 3 of Putin’s invasion, Phase 1 being the invasion and annexation of Crimea and Phase 2 the invasion of the Donbas Region of Southeastern Ukraine.

Because of these conditions, our Ukrainian Orthodox of the USA announced on that third day, the establishment of a fund-raising appeal that would appear on our Church website – uocofusa.org and the Ukrainian Orthodox Church of the USA Facebook page. To say that the response has been incredible is an understatement. As these words are written the total amount contributed now exceeds \$825,000!!! Metropolitan Antony and especially Archbishop Daniel have been in the forefront of this fund-raising effort with dozens of interviews through all forms of media and most importantly, prayers and meetings with leaders of other religious bodies. The outpouring of support and promises of much more to come, has created a major effort for our hierarchs and the Consistory. The means and methods of distributing these funds – “EXPRESSIONS OF LOVE” – is an enormous task for which we are most thankful to God for His assignment to us. We want to inform all our donors and prospective donors about the progress of this effort as frequently as possible.

The hierarchs of the Church have been in touch with the Orthodox Church of Ukraine and His Beatitude Metropolitan Epiphaniy of Kyiv and All-Ukraine since the beginning of the conflict. In fact, Archbishop Daniel has been communicating directly with the Metropolitan almost daily. As of this moment, the UOC of the USA transferred \$100,000.00 to the Orthodox Church of the Ukraine for the church’s ongoing charitable activities throughout the nation.

Our Church’s support of senior men and women forced to flee from their homes following phase 2 of Putin’s invasion into the Donbas Region of Ukraine. The charitable effort has been conducted selflessly by His Eminence Metropolitan Serhii of Donetsk, who resides in the city of Mariupol, which has been heavily bombed by the Russian military forces for the past several weeks. The humanitarian aid of the Church reached the city of Mariupol.

Working closely with the representatives of the Orthodox Church of Ukraine in Volyn region, the Church has transferred \$50,000 for the needs of the refugees and families of the wounded and lost soldiers of the Ukrainian Armed Forces. We are grateful to Deacon Andrii Sydor for coordinating the humanitarian efforts in that area and throughout this area.

We have partnered in charitable efforts with the Ukrainian Orthodox parish communities in Germany, especially in Munich, in the purchase of many forms of humanitarian aid, which is delivered to various safe locations in Ukraine, driven by Ukrainian citizens, the most recent delivery arrived to St. Michael's Golden Dome Monastery in Kyiv, Ukraine.

Well known and trusted Kharkiv volunteers received \$5,000 in financial assistance to provide basic food needs for the survivors of the continued bombing of the city by Russian military forces. The city has been greatly destroyed and is surrounded, prohibiting the delivery of food and water to the remaining citizens.

During a visit to Constantinople for meetings with His All-Holiness, Patriarch Bartholomew, our hierarchs visited the Ukrainian Consulate and delivered \$20,000 to aid the ongoing purchase and shipment of medical and food supplies to several areas of Ukraine.

In the coming days and weeks, there will be meetings with various other charitable organizations with whom we hope to cooperate in the further distribution of our contributed funds. One of the most important of these will be International Orthodox Christian Charities (IOCC), which has outstanding experience in distributing funds throughout the world to disaster areas and sites of catastrophe. Such cooperation relieves the Church of "reinventing the wheel" in our own distribution process. [The IOCC already has its own Ukrainian Aid Fund](#) with contributions equal to those our Church has received.
